Dear Mr. Craig,

Thank you very much for introducing us to Permaguard Fossil Shell Flour a year and a half ago.

It is my responsibility to give our calves and young cattle the best care possible. Since I have been feeding Fossil Flour I have noticed several things which I would like to tell you about. Sickness in the calves and steers has been greatly reduced. It has decreased inflammatory problem in the steers. The calves have been healthier than before. The calves and steers appear to be in better physical condition and have shinier coats. Both wintered very well.

We feed the animals on a 2% ratio to regular feed.

Perhaps a very important result of using Permaguard is the fact that the fly problem has been controlled considerably, both on the animals and in the penned area. This, I believe is due in part to the fact that the Fossil Flour is not digested, as you told me, and, after excretion, does kill flies and larvae. The animals are getting good use of the trace minerals in the Fossil Flour.


Another thing is that the excrement odor has almost been eliminated, therefore not attracting the flies.

I have told my boss that I always want to feed Fossil Flour to my calves and steers.

We have also begun a dust spraying program around the whole dairy area and definitely see a tremendous reduction in flies and all other insects.
